



The Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS) is pleased to announce a new, enhanced version of Victim Information and Notification Everyday (VINE®) – a system which provides victims of crime with timely and reliable offender custody information. The new version modernizes the VINE platform and will now include a service provider directory. We hope you will choose to be a part of this important new resource for crime victims in Maryland.

Please read the following criteria and guidelines before submitting your agency's information for review:

- The agency/organization must provide services in Maryland, regardless of where the agency is located. Services can include, but are not limited to, emergency support, basic needs, counseling, healthcare, legal/financial support, housing, and children's services.
- Eligible agencies/organizations include state government agencies, local government agencies, and non-profit, non-governmental organizations, including faith-based and community organizations.
- Agencies/organizations will be responsible for updating and maintaining their own information. Failure to update annually will be grounds for removal from the directory.
- The Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services is assisting DPSCS in the transition to the new version of VINE. - Maryland VINE reserves the right to include or exclude any agency or organization at its discretion.

The following are not eligible to participate:

- Agencies/organizations that discriminate against individuals based on race, age, gender, religion, sexual orientation, or similar factors.
- Agencies/organizations that misrepresent themselves or their services in any way, including non-delivery of services, or that are engaged in illegal or fraudulent activities.
- Agencies/organizations that do not provide services in Maryland.
