The Information Technology/Criminal Justice Information Sharing Division of the North Dakota Office of Attorney General (ND IT/CJIS) is pleased to announce a new version of the North Dakota Statewide Automated Victim and Notification program, also referred to as ND SAVIN.

The ND SAVIN program maintains a directory listing of eligible victim services in the state to connect individuals with relevant resources and services in their area.

These services include emergency housing, advocacy, crisis intervention, information, and other referral services.

Eligible service providers must:

1. be operated by a criminal justice agency, governmental unit, public or private non-profit, or a tribal agency, and
2. have a primary purpose to provide direct services to victims of crime, and
3. be located within the state of North Dakota, and
4. serve primarily ND residents.

Service providers must provide advocacy with, information about, or referral to one or more of the following:

- Court system
- Legal counsel
- Medical community
- Social service financial assistance programs
- Social service support services
- Community self-help groups
- Mental health professionals
- Law enforcement agencies

ND IT/CJIS will use the guidelines above to make a determination about inclusion in the directory. ND IT/CJIS may also consult with other participating organizations and relevant agencies regarding the appropriateness of including a specific provider in the directory.

In the event a request for inclusion is denied, the service provider may petition the North Dakota Office of Attorney General, in writing, for reconsideration. Decisions rendered related to such a petition are final.
