### Join the Michigan VINE Service Provider Directory

VINE® (Victim Information and Notification Everyday) is a solution that provides victims of crime with access to timely and reliable offender information for over 90% of the U.S. incarcerations. Ensuring peace of mind, VINE offers victims different options to get the information they need: call a toll-free number, visit [www.vinelink.com](http://www.vinelink.com), or use the VINELink mobile app to check on an offender's custody status. Victims can also register to be notified when an offender's custody status changes via phone, email, text, or TTY for the hearing or speech impaired.



### Reach More Victims with the Michigan VINE Service Provider Directory

Fewer than one in ten victims of serious violent crime in the U.S. receive assistance from a victim service agency.<sup>1</sup> The VINE service provider directory addresses this challenge by connecting victims to the services they need to begin the healing process.

The VINE Service Provider Directory centralizes information by offering a listing of victim service providers in Michigan and nationally. VINE is a free and anonymous service intended to support victims of crime. More than 100,000 searches for victim service providers are conducted by VINE users annually.

In Michigan, VINE is administered by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services' Division of Victim Services. By participating in the directory, your organization can connect with and promote services to crime survivors, including over 213,000 VINE users in Michigan.

Victims are able to save offenders to a personalized "Watch List."

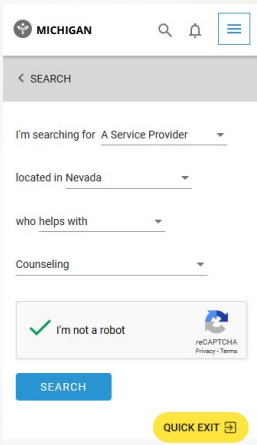


## Interactive Voice Response

Callers are able to search for offenders using advanced voice and keypad technology.

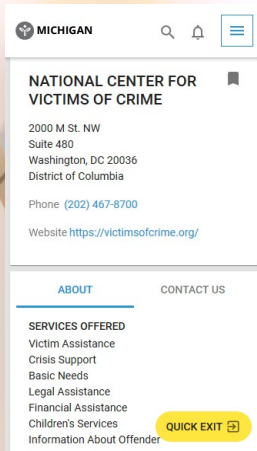
### Service Provider Search

Victims can view provider profiles for information such as mission, location, phone numbers, and website.



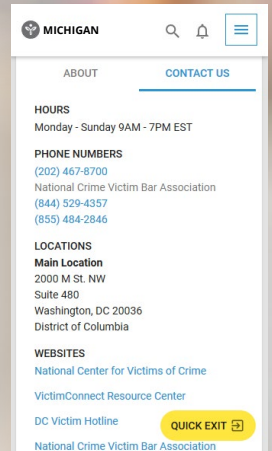
### Saved Service Providers
