Any workers who finds themselves the victim of an imposter UI claim can follow the below steps:

- Report the incident to <https://identitytheft.gov/> which is managed by the Federal Trade Commission
- Report the incident to the US Department of Labor at <https://www.dol.gov/agencies/eta/UIIDtheft>
- Contact a local law enforcement agency and file a report (when possible)
- Report the incident to the state in which the imposter claim was filed using the links below
