Law enforcement agencies know that access to timely, reliable, and unique data is critical to solving investigations and operating efficiently. Too often antiquated technology, data roadblocks, and unreliable records contribute to the primary challenge facing agencies today: increased responsibilities with limited dollars and no additional staff.

Moreover, warrant lists continue to grow, exacerbating the administrative burden facing agencies. Nationwide, there are an estimated 10 million outstanding warrants.¹

- Large number of potentially unsafe individuals free and in our communities
- Time and money wasted using manual processes to track down wanted persons

Strengthen investigations with cross-jurisdictional booking and release data

Many law enforcement agencies are using incarceration data that is incomplete, unreliable, or limited in scope. Access to pointer information that may relate to an individual's historical interactions with U.S jails and prisons, along with their current incarceration status, greatly assists investigators in their location and apprehension efforts.

The Justice Intelligence pointer solution helps investigators:

- Identify patterns of criminal activity that occur across cities, counties, and states.
- Determine if a wanted person is currently incarcerated in a different jurisdiction.
- Ensure officer safety by serving more warrants in a safe, sanitized location

Monitor information related to persons of interest and receive near real-time alerts

Justice Intelligence allows agencies to monitor and receive pointer alerts when an information related to an individual indicates an individual is booked into, released from, or has served a certain length of stay at an incarceration facility.

¹ A Columbus Dispatch and GateHouse Media investigation in 2018 found 5.7 million warrants across 27 states, and concluded that nationwide, "that number could double."

The Carter County (TN) Sheriff's Office uses Justice Intelligence to monitor their list of outstanding warrants. The solution has produced outstanding results:

1. Workloads associated with serving warrants have been reduced by an estimated 30-35%.
2. The solution leads to 30% of all arrest warrants served.
3. In the first year, the number of crimes reported in Carter County decreased by 29%.
