Subsidy Landscape

An on-going Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliance hurdle employers face is managing subsidy notifications and appeals. Because subsidies, also referred to as Advance Premium Tax Credits, are the trigger for penalties, it's important to be prepared to handle the flood of notifications that the Exchanges will send. Employers will receive a Notice of Employee Eligibility when an employee enrolls in coverage through an Exchange and receives a subsidy. Once the notice is sent, employers will have 90 days — and only one chance — to appeal the Exchange's determination that the employee was eligible for a subsidy.

The Challenge

Currently the Federal Exchange will only receive appeal documentation via fax and mail, making the process even more cumbersome and hard to track. The Exchanges may send notices in batches, which can increase the chance of multiple notices going to the wrong location at once. For example, several employees may enter the address of the location where they work instead of the address where the notifications should be sent, such as your headquarters or HR department. When the notices are sent to the wrong location, corralling and responding to those notices within 90 days can be nearly impossible.
